What *can't* I bring?

Modern latex paint (see below for more info.)
weapons, explosives, ammunition, radioactive materials,
debris, asphalt, shingles, building supplies and trash
since it is not considered household hazardous waste.

Latex paints qualify as hazardous waste if they:

- Were manufactured before 1980 (may contain lead)
- Are labeled "mildew resistant" (contain pesticides)
- Are labeled "wood preservative" (contain pesticides)

Disposing of Latex Paints

Latex paint is less toxic than oil-based paint, but it still contains chemicals. When not disposed of properly, it can seep into groundwater and bodies of water. While it's okay to rinse brushes and rollers and clean your hands at a sink after painting with latex, **do not pour paint down the drain**. Instead, try these options:

- **Dry it up:** Use kitty litter, shredded paper or sawdust to absorb the remaining paint; after it dries place the can in the garbage.
- **Donate it:** Ask friends and neighbors if they need paint for a small project. Local theater groups or schools sometimes look for free paint for sets and art projects.
- **Store it:** Save the leftover paint for future touch-ups. To prevent the paint from drying out, wrap the can's lid securely with plastic wrap.

We want to make it simple for you to dispose of hazardous wastes properly. Our HHWP can take hazardous materials from businesses and organizations which meet the following criteria: Produce less than 220 pounds of hazardous waste a month, and never accumulate more than 2,200 pounds of material at a time.
