

## 2024 Student Conservation Fair: Participant Instructions

1. Choose a topic you find interesting
2. Decide whether you would like to present research on this topic or create artwork that represents the topic
  - a. Research Project
    - i. Ask your parents for help when using the internet
    - ii. Consider going to the library for research material
    - iii. Create a poster, tri-fold poster, display, etc. with the information you learn (make sure to include fun facts!)
  - b. Artwork
    - i. Ask your parents for help when using the internet
    - ii. Decide what kind of art you would like to do
      1. Drawing
      2. Painting
      3. Paper mâché
      4. Photography
      5. Etc.
    - iii. Make sure your artwork represents your topic in some way
      1. For example, water quality could include a painting of a clean lake vs a polluted lake
3. Your project must be finished by June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024.
4. Ask your parents for help filling out the registration form and sending it in
5. On June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024 you will bring your project to the Art in a Garden Festival
  - a. Arrival at 10 am
6. You will need to be at the booth for 1 hour at some point in the day to represent your project
7. Festival attendees will vote on the projects throughout the day
8. Winners
  - a. Projects will be voted on by attendees, and winners announced at 3:30pm
  - b. Projects will be judged on creativity and accuracy of information
  - c. Artwork and research projects will be judged separately
  - d. You are not required to attend the winner announcement but it is encouraged
  - e. Everyone will receive a certificate for participating
